What is International Young Breeders Organization?

- This is an organization made up of volunteers from the various competing studbooks from around the world
- Every two years a competition is held, bringing together all of the studbooks to show off their breeding knowledge, handling skills, judging skills and grooming skills.
- Above all, the aim is to learn about horses, make new friends and network with other young sport horse breeders and enthusiasts across the world.



Who can compete?

- Each studbook can send a Junior Team and a Senior Team comprised of four members each
- Studbooks may be able to send individuals as well if the competitions allows for extras in that particular year
- Junior Team age eligibility is:
 15 19 as of January 1st of the competition year
- Senior Team age eligibility is:
 20 25 as of January 1st of the competition year



What happens at the competition?



- There are five portions of the competition:
- Written Theory Test
- Conformation Judging
- Free jump Judging
- Turnout Competition
- In-Hand Presentation

Written Theory Test

- Multiple choice test that includes questions on:
- feeding
- breeding
- stable management
- veterinary
- anatomy
- WBFSH Organization/ International Sport
- A question and answer booklet with potential test questions is provided prior to the competition for teams to study
- Marked individually and added together for a team score



Conformation Judging

- First, one horse will be judged by the senior judges panel and the marks will be told to all competitors so they are aware of the baseline
- Three horses are then presented for the competitors to inspect
- The panel of Senior Judges inspect the horses at the same time
- The goal is to score as close to the senior judges as possible aka judge the horse as closely to international standards as possible
- All aspects of the conformation and correctness of gaits are included in this portion
- Scored individually and added together for a team score





Free Jump Judging

- First, two horses will be judged by the senior judges panel and the marks will be told to all competitors so they are aware of the baseline
- Five horses are then presented for the competitors to inspect
- The panel of Senior Judges inspect the horses at the same time
- The goal is to score as close to the senior judges as possible aka judge the horse as closely to international standards as possible
- All aspects of the free jump and loose movement are included in this portion
- Scored individually and added together for a team score



Turnout Competition

- As a team (split into senior & junior teams) prepare a horse for FEI level competition including mane plaits (braids)
- Horse should be immaculately groomed with perfect mane and tail braids
- Presented to the judges in a bridle (which also needs to be spotless)



In-Hand Competition - Presenting a Horse

- Every competitor will get a horse by the organization to present on the triangle, in hand.
- Each competitor may select a team member to be their whipper
- Judged on:
- Entering the triangle, verbal presentation of the horse & horse stance set up, horse walk, horse trot and second horse stance
- Overall presentation is also scored:
- Optimum presentation of the horse; in control and not interfering negatively with the horse's paces
- Intuition
- (positive) risk taking
- situation-based decision making in favour of the horse (keeping strong horses under control whilst calming them down; motivating tired or very quiet horses) in the best possible or necessary way
