

Mare Production Premiums Allocation of Points

1997 National AGM, ON - Mare Premium system announced
2007 National AGM, MB - First Elite Mare & Production Premiums announced
2017 Mare Production Premium point system clarified to include Award Program points

The premium system was introduced to encourage breeders to present mares for inspection early, when they should get their best scores. Mares may be presented at age two, and up.

The incentive is there for proving mares in performance through Riding Horse Tests, material classes and in open performance. Premiums earned in Riding Horse Tests and Material classes will be recorded by CWHBA. More provinces are hosting Riding Horse Tests as well as material classes including Jumper Material.

For other Performance premiums achieved from Open competition, owner's must provide necessary documentation to the office. Please keep your Equine Canada Passport current in order to document those results. Performance results will be verified.

Entered Mares are eligible to achieve these awards.

MARE PREMIUM BYLAWS:

1.0. Mare premiums shall be awarded to recognize and encourage excellence in our broodmares. The following regulations shall apply:-

- 1.1. Only results of two year old and older horses from evaluations and performance scores will be considered.
- 1.2. Premiums will be awarded in three categories:
 - 1.2.1. Inspection Premium - (conformation)
 - 1.2.2. Performance results
 - 1.2.3. Offspring inspection and performance results (Production)
- 1.3. An Elite Mare Award will be presented based on accumulated points in premium categories.

INSPECTION PREMIUMS:

Including mare and progeny (aged 2 years and over) evaluations

- Premium inspection score 7.5 and above - 2 points
- Premium inspection score 7.0 - 7.49 - 1 point

PERFORMANCE PREMIUMS: *Maximum 3 performance points per individual are eligible for calculations.*

3 points:

- Competition results as for stallion, earned performance requirements:
 - successful completion of a Stallion Performance Test
 - have been placed in the first three,
 - five times in Intermediaire dressage competition or,
 - five times in National Open Jumper competitions or,
 - three times in the first ten in Concours Complete International Two Star (CCI**) competition or have,
 - won 3 Open Hunter Championships at class 1 shows
- CWHBA Achievement Award - level 3
- CWHBA Achievement Award - Lifetime

2 points:

- Material class winner (five or more entries)
- Mare/riding horse test score 7.5 or better

Mare Production Premiums Allocation of Points

- Competition results - EC/CEF or USEA/AHSA shows:
 - Dressage, Level 3 - 60% or better three times; or
 - Jumper, 4'/1.25 m division into jump-off three times; or
 - Eventing, Training score under 50 pts three times; or
 - Hunter, 3'6"/1.1 m division, three times placed third or better
- CWHBA Achievement Award - Level 2

1 point:

- Material class winner (four entries or less)
- Mare/riding horse test score 7.0 - 7.49
- CWHBA Achievement Award - Level 1

** Results from non-recognized competition, or from outside Registry competition may be accepted under the same system as above at the discretion of the Committee.

PRODUCTION PREMIUMS:

- A production Premium is based on the total of points in the above categories, accumulated by offspring of an Entered Mare from inspection or performance.
- A minimum of one (1) point earning progeny must be registered Canadian Warmblood. Results from Foreign registered, and/or entered progeny may be used for additional points.
- An Entered Mare may use a maximum of three (3) points from performance results and a maximum two (2) points from Inspection premium per individual offspring... maximum 5 points for any one progeny.

Example: where the Mare has produced a fully approved stallion son, she would accumulate the following points:-

- 3 points for the stallion's performance testing, *plus*
- 1 point for a stallion inspection score of 7.0 - 7.49, *or*
- 2 points for a stallion inspection score of 7.5 and over
- **5 points Production Premium** - offspring accumulate 5 points (earns 5 points toward Elite Mare Award); mare receives the Production Premium stall plaque
- **3 points Production Premium** - offspring accumulate 3 points (earns 3 points toward Elite Mare Award); mare is listed in the tabulations as having earned 3 points

ELITE MARE AWARD:

10 points required total.

- Points accumulate from Inspection, Performance and Production Premiums of the mare and/or her offspring but may consist entirely of Production Premium points earned by offspring of the Elite Mare applicant.
- An eligible mare may use a maximum of three (3) points from her performance results and a maximum two (2) points from her Inspection results towards Elite Mare ... maximum 5 points.
- Application for an Elite Mare Award must be made to the Awards Committee or Stud Book Committee with the appropriate documentation to verify performance records and offspring pedigrees.
